 - The experiences, skills, and values you would bring to the Peaceworker Program (note: We welcome your reflections upon your identity and background (i.e., culture/ethnicity, religion, socio-economic class, race, gender, sexual orientation, other...). For example, are there aspects of your identity or background from which you have gained valuable insights, skills, or character strengths?);
 - How you imagine concretely linking your area of social concern and your proposed graduate program; and
 - Given the focus of the Peaceworker Program on "solving the problems of the city," explain your interest in working in urban America, including prior experiences, how you envision integrating your Peace Corps experience into a domestic program, and how this might relate to your career goals and what you would hope to be able to do after completing the Peaceworker program.
 - The statement should be between 500-750 words in length.
- (2) A résumé or C.V.;
- (3) A copy of your "Description of Peace Corps Volunteer Service" (D.O.S.);
- (4) One official copy of your academic transcript(s); and
- (5) Complete contact information for three people who can provide a reference for you. Collectively, they should be able to speak knowledgeably about (i) your academic abilities; (ii) your work/service habits and abilities; and, (iii) your values and commitments. At least one of these recommendations should come from a Peace Corps source. Another recommendation should come from an academic source (e.g., past faculty, etc.).
 - Please list your recommenders on the following sheet and submit with your application.
- (6) Complete an online FAFSA using the UMBC school code 002105 (informational bookmark included). Applicants applying to consortium schools will have to file their FAFSA including both their consortium school code and the UMBC school code. FAFSA results will be reported to the Peaceworker Program directly; you do not have to mail any FAFSA information to the Peaceworker Program.
